Welcome to Skomer Island

Thank you for booking your overnight stay on Skomer Island - we are excited to welcome you to our island home! It is vital that you read all of the information over the next few pages - given how unique the island is, there are perhaps some unexpected points!

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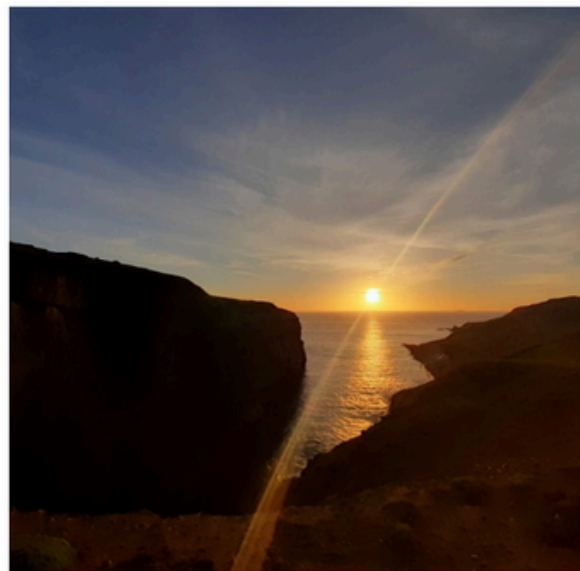

At A Glance...

- **Bring**
 - Bed sheet and pillowcase and *either* sleeping bag or duvet cover
 - Food and medication (there is no shop on Skomer)
 - Towel and toiletries
 - Bin bag for rubbish
 - Red torch to look at Manx Shearwaters
 - Suitable clothing for all weathers (including waterproofs and warm layers)
 - Indoor shoes/slippers
- **Boat** - The boat is £20 adults and £15 under 12s total (price includes both ways) - please bring cash or book online with Pembrokeshire Islands ahead of your stay [here](#). Please note this is for booking just the boat and **NOT your hostel stay**.
- **Biosecurity** - Pack belongings in sealed bags/bags
- **Call the Visitor Officer** - Call Rob on 07530 796150 the day before you are due to arrive to confirm the boat time - please call between 12pm and 5pm
- **Book your car** - Book in at West Hook Farm (01646 636424)
- **Pack light** - 15kg bag weight limit - many light bags are better than one heavy one



Packing and Biosecurity

We ask all overnight guests and volunteers on Skomer and Skokholm to adhere to our biosecurity measures to help protect the islands from rats and other invasive species

Why is biosecurity important?

Skomer and Skokholm are of international importance due to their populations of ground-nesting seabirds. The absence of rats, mink, stoats and other ground predators allows ground-nesting birds like Manx Shearwaters and Atlantic Puffins to thrive.

If rats were introduced to the island, even accidentally, they would decimate our seabird populations. This has happened on islands around the world and is a real threat to our seabirds.

Packing and Biosecurity

Please follow these three steps to prevent rats or any other invasive species being introduced to the island.

1. All luggage must be closed - unsealed luggage, including open bags and carrier bags will not be permitted to land. The pictures below will help you.
2. Pack all luggage yourself in a rodent-free environment and please ensure to leave it sealed and in a rodent-free environment before coming. On the day of arrival, please inspect your luggage before putting it on the boat.
3. Do not leave your luggage unattended in Martin's Haven to ensure rodents cannot enter your bags.

Getting Here

Where does the boat leave from?

The boat departure point is Martin's Haven (OS reference: SM760091, W3W: braced.chef.conqueror). It is two miles from Marloes and twelve miles southwest of Haverfordwest.

Arriving by car?

Please follow Satnav directions to Martin's Haven or SA62 3BJ.

From Haverfordwest, it takes at least 30 minutes on winding roads to reach Martin's Haven. Follow Dale Road (B4327) for just over 10 miles, before following signs on to Gay Lane in Marloes. Stay on the main road through the village and continue west for 1.5 miles. Please be aware that this road is windy and uses passing places.

Arriving by public transport?

The nearest train stations are Milford Haven and Haverfordwest. Fflecsi Buses run from both towns whilst the Puffin Shuttle runs from St David's.

Taxis will cost you around £25-£30 from Haverfordwest and Milford Haven. You can find a list of taxi companies [here](#).

Coming from further afield?

There are good car rental and train connections from Cardiff Airport.

Parking

We would recommend booking your car into West Hook Farm (01646 636424).



Before the National Trust car park, the farm is on the right (look for the Puffin gate posts). It is about a 10 minute walk from here to the boat. We advise dropping your bags down at the beach before parking - take care as it gets a little tight. Remember, your bags must be supervised for biosecurity purposes.

Book Your Hostel Boat

New for 2025, you can book your hostel boat in advance of your stay and remove the need to bring cash. Once your stay is confirmed, you can do this [here](#) or by scanning this QR code. Alternatively, please bring cash to give the boat crew (£20 adult, £15 child).

Please note this is for booking just the boat and **NOT your hostel stay.**

Call the Visitor Officer

We ask that you call us on 07530 796150 between 12pm and 5pm to confirm that your boat is running and the time of your departure. Please note boats will only run in favourable weather conditions - we have to take the boat skipper call on this.

Crossing to Skomer via boat

Your boat will usually depart from Martin's Haven at 9am.

You will need to be ready on the jetty (to the left, up and over the steps) with all of your sealed bags 15 minutes before departure. Please note, there will be no staff to assist with your bags on this side of the crossing or on your return.

Your return journey to the mainland will usually leave Skomer around 9.30am.

Your journey to Skomer

Upon arrival, we need to transport your belongings up the 87 island steps to our Dumper Truck. We form a human chain with everyone able to take part to pass all luggage up the steps.

As such, we're asking everyone to bring bags under 15kg as we've seen a big increase in recent years - many small and light ones are fine! If your bag is oversized, it will be left at the bottom for you to unpack to a suitable weight or carry yourself. We are legally bound to protect our staff, volunteers and visitors from injury and oversized bags can cause problems. Please note that where we have too many bags for the dumper, some may need to be carried.

Our hostel accommodation

Up at the Farm, we unload your bags and get you settled in to the hostel. Once this is done, the island is yours to explore!



Your Accommodation

You will be staying in a converted old farm building nestled in the very heart of the island. Although basic, the hostel has everything you will need for the duration of your stay.

Kitchen

The shared kitchen has two gas ovens, a large fridge and two sinks (with drinking water). In various cupboards you'll find all crockery, cutlery, pots and pans. Remember, you will need to bring enough food for the duration of your stay.

Bathrooms

There are two shared bathrooms in the hostel - complete with shower, sink, and flushing toilet.

Lounge

Our spacious lounge doubles up as a dining room. Here you'll also find a comfortable sofa, and a log burner* - perfect to curl up in front of on a chilly evening!

Bedrooms

All beds are single beds (though some are bunk beds) and you will need to remember your bedding. Please note there is no heating on Skomer, so we recommend bringing a hot water bottle and extra layers in the colder months (blankets are provided).

*Anyone wishing to use the log burner will need to bring their own wood. We ask you to purchase hotties or blazers, as they come in sealed packaging and are therefore less of a biosecurity risk.



An Off Grid Island

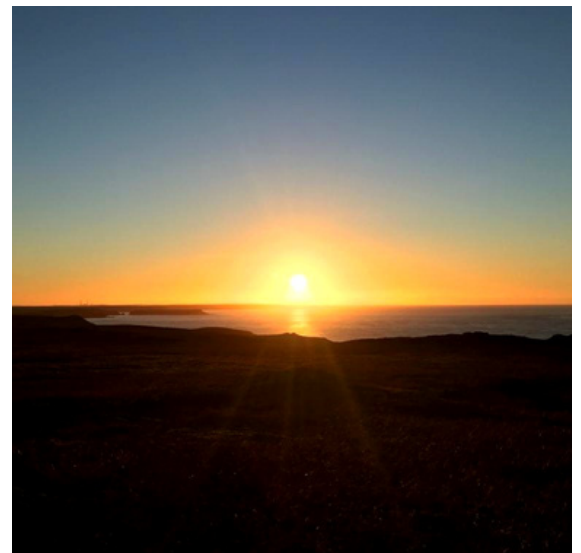
We are completely off grid here on the island - our electricity is generated by solar panels, water comes from the well, and gas is bought onto the island in cannisters.

What does this mean for you?

- There are only eight plug sockets in the Hostel. These can only be used for charging phones/laptops/cameras. No high energy appliances (i.e. kettles, microwaves, hair dryers, etc.) or extension cables can be used. Please note there is no WiFi available and limited internet and phone signal.
- Please limit your water usage - there may be times when showers are closed due to drought. Water is heated using solar and a gas boiler which means that hot water may not be available 24/7.
- Please only use the cleaning products provided - we have a septic tank which can be easily damaged by harsh chemicals.

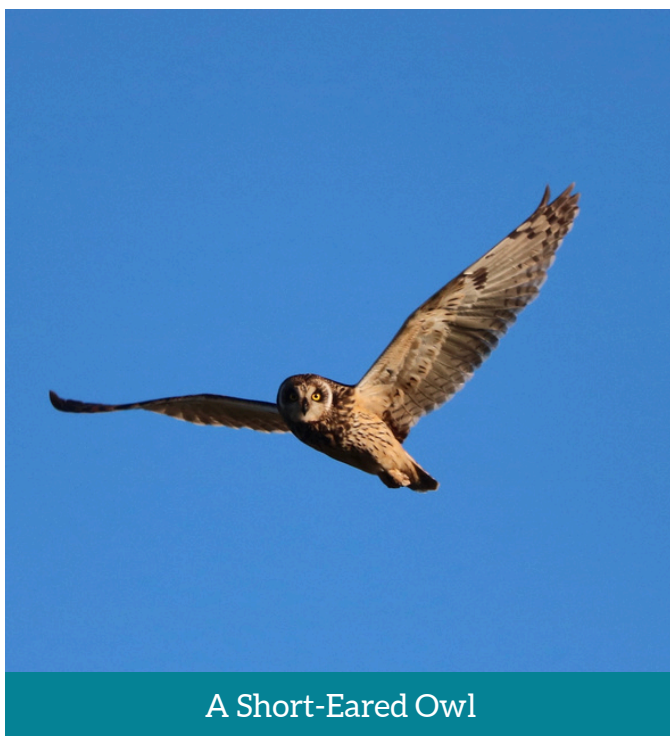
